

PERSONAL CARE

Baby changing stations are located in the following areas:

- Daly Innovation and Collaboration Building — first, second and eighth floors, both men’s and women’s restrooms
- Jenkins Health and Technology Building — all floors, men’s and women’s restrooms
- Macdonald-Kelce Library — first floor, women’s restroom
- Martinez Athletics Center — first floor, family restroom
- Morsani Hall — first floor, women’s and family restroom
- Naimoli Family Softball Complex — outside of facility, women’s restroom
- Plant Hall — first floor, women’s restroom
- Vaughn Center — first floor, both men’s and women’s restrooms

Lactation Rooms are located in the following areas:

- Jenkins Health Building — fifth floor
- Grand Center — first floor
- Thompson Building — second floor

Unisex bathrooms are located in most buildings on campus. To find exact locations, visit utampa.edu/map and search for unisex bathrooms.

PET POLICY

Pets are not allowed on the UTampa campus or University-controlled properties.

This prohibition does not apply to individuals with service animals or individuals with a disability for which an emotional support animal has been approved. For more information on whether your animal is permitted to be on campus, please contact the University prior to your visit.

WEATHER

UTampa is a National Weather Service-certified **StormReady®** university and is one of 326 colleges and universities around the country that have put special operations in place to monitor and react to severe weather conditions, such as hurricanes, tornadoes and storms. UTampa uses a **campus-wide lightning prediction and warning system** to help alert the campus community about impending inclement weather and lightning on or around the campus. The system emits an audible horn blast when atmospheric weather conditions are likely to produce dangerous lightning strikes on or around the campus. In these cases, the system will emit a 15-second warning blast, and the strobe lights on the units will illuminate as long as there is danger of a potential strike. Once the lightning threat passes, three, five-second horn blasts will indicate an “all clear,” and the strobe lights will turn off.

UTampa uses text and email messaging for the speedy notification of emergencies on campus to students, faculty and staff. Emergency information is also posted on the UTampa website as soon as possible for updates to the general public.

BICYCLES ON CAMPUS

Students, faculty and staff can register their bikes through UTampa SpartanNet. All bicycles should be properly locked to one of the bike racks on campus. Bike racks are located outside most residence halls and academic buildings. Campus Safety will impound all unsecured bikes.

DO NOT lock bicycles to any railings, doors, landscaping or anywhere other than the bike racks. Inappropriately locked bicycles will be impounded by Campus Safety.

BikeUTampa is a University-wide free bike rental program offering the campus community bike rentals on a daily basis with a valid Spartan ID. Sign up at the front desk of the Riseman Fitness and Recreation Center.

ELECTRIC SCOOTERS

While UTampa encourages alternative transportation, due to health and safety concerns, the **UTampa campus is considered a “no ride zone”** for rented electric scooters. UTampa and local community members who choose to use rented electric scooters are asked to leave them at the vendor’s off-campus scooter corrals or at a safe, unobtrusive site on the perimeter of campus.

Personally owned electric scooters are prohibited in all University buildings except for the designated areas in the Grand Center and University parking garages. Residential students may charge their devices at designated campus e-charging stations. **These devices may not be charged in any other University building, at any time.**

Anyone violating the University’s parking policies may have their vehicle ticketed, booted or impounded by private property owners, the city of Tampa and/or the University.

WELCOME TO CAMPUS

The Campus Safety office is located on the first floor of the Daly Innovation and Collaboration Building, 820 W. North A Street, and may be reached at (813) 257-7777 or via email at campussafety@ut.edu.

PARKING POLICY HIGHLIGHTS

- Anyone parking a vehicle at UTampa is required to register their vehicle and display the appropriate parking pass.
- Visitors are only required to have a parking pass Monday–Friday, 7 a.m.–5 p.m., or if the vehicle will be on campus overnight. Visitor parking passes are obtained via online request at least one business day prior to, or in person day-of, at the Campus Safety office.
- It is illegal to park anywhere on campus other than a clearly marked parking space. The absence of “No Parking” or “Fire Lane” signs, lack of curb paint, or enough room for a vehicle to park does not suggest that parking is permitted. Parking is not allowed on West North A Street, Brevard Avenue or UT Poe Parkway.
- To ensure optimal parking availability and safety for University community members and visitors, parking rules are always enforced. This includes breaks, closures or University operational changes.

VISITOR PARKING AREAS

- Thomas Parking Garage, first floor (entrance is on West North A Street, across from the Daly Innovation and Collaboration Building); West Parking Garage, second floor; street parking in front of the Grand Center (these spaces require a visitor permit at all times)
- **Admissions guests** may use the parking lots on UT University Drive by the Southard Family Building and the Macdonald-Kelce Library from 7 a.m.–5 p.m., and must obtain a pass from the admissions office. **After 5 p.m., these lots are available to all University visitors.**
- Visitors to the Lowth Entrepreneurship Center may use the reserved spaces on the seventh floor (entrance off Frederic H. Spaulding Drive) or the visitor spaces on the first floor of the Thomas Parking Garage (entrance off West North A Street). **A pass must be obtained from Lowth Center staff.**

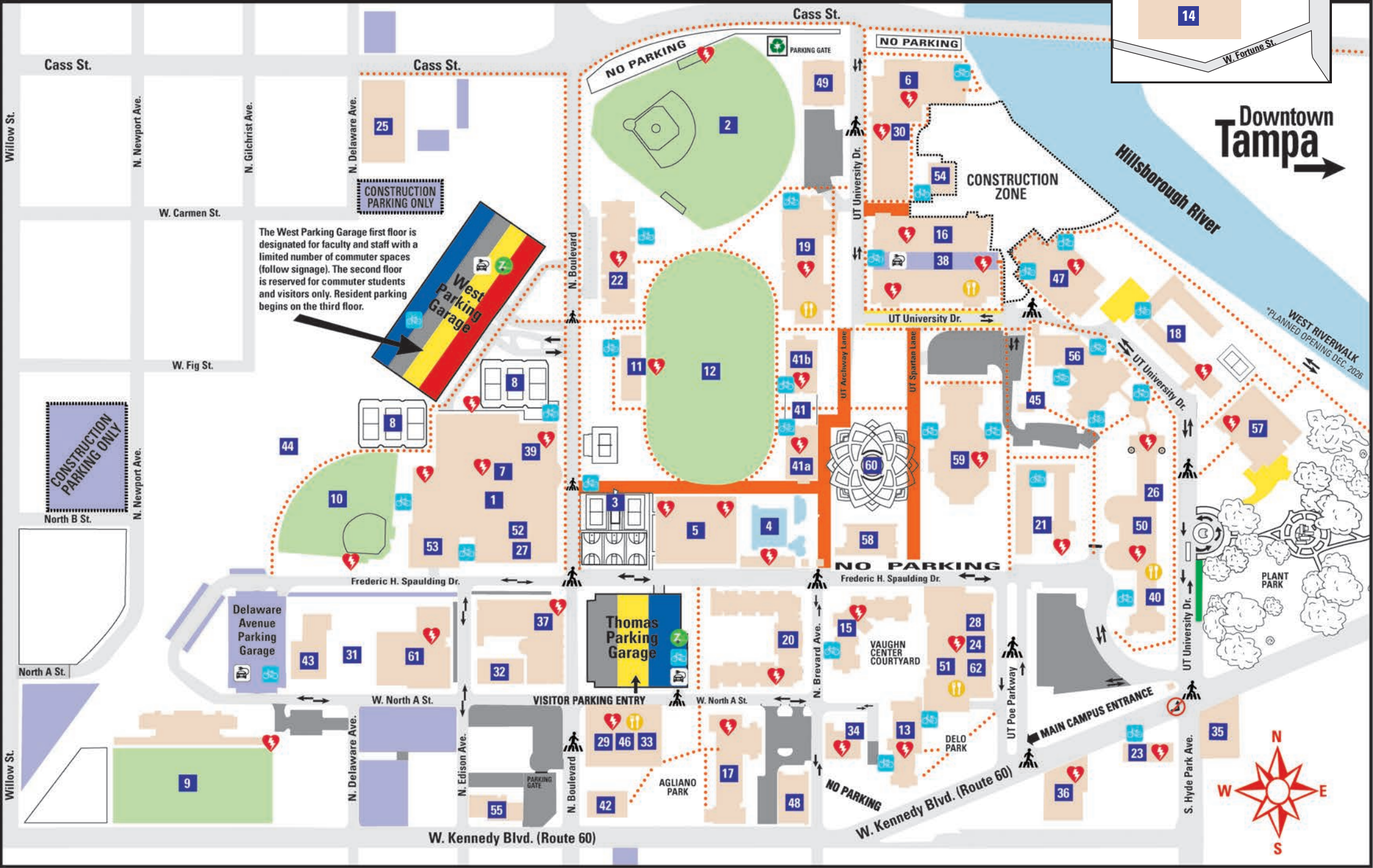
ELECTRIC VEHICLES

- Electric vehicle charging stations are available in the Delaware, Grand Center, Thomas and West parking garages.
- Electric vehicle charging outlets in Thomas Garage, first floor, are reserved for visitors.
- Vehicles may only be charged using approved charging equipment.
- Vehicle must be actively charging.

CAR SHARING

UTampa partners with Zipcar to offer a car sharing program on campus. The convenient, economical transportation option is available 24 hours a day, seven days a week for eligible students, faculty and staff ages 18 and older.
